



## Requirements

1. Organize a collection for the World Friendship Fund (National) or the World Scouting Contributions (Council) at a council, district or unit event. (There is no minimum contribution.). All money collected should be submitted to the Council Service Center.
2. Assist a minimum of one den (Cub Scouts or Webelos) or one patrol (Boy Scouts or Varsity Scouts) or a Venturing unit in completing the requirements for their International Activity Patch.
3. Serve for at least one year on the Council International Committee, or assist the committee at one of their displays at a council function (training, etc.) or other council event. Contact the Longhorn Council International Representative for more information.
4. Teach Citizenship in the World merit badge to at least five Scouts.
5. Host one or more International Scouts or Scouters for dinner or for a period of time in your home. Share your experiences with your District or Scout unit.
6. Participate in an International Scout Jamboree/Camporee (either in the US or a foreign country) or other International Scout event. Share your experience with a Cub Scout or Webelos Den or Pack, a Boy Scout Troop or Varsity Scout group or a Venturing Crew. All units traveling outside US must have a National Tour Permit approved by the International Representative
7. Earn the Interpreter strip for any other language than your native tongue.
8. Attend a Scout meeting or other function of Scouting in another country. Share this experience with someone in your district or council. Individuals or groups traveling abroad should apply for an "International Letter of Introduction from the BSA International Division. Applications are available from the Council Service Center.
9. Assist your unit or district or other Scout unit to participate in the Jamboree-on-the Air. More information can be found at the following link: <http://www.scout.org/jota>
10. Assist a Scout or unit to secure a pen-pal in another country. Contact the Longhorn Council International Representative for procedures.
11. Earn the "International Scouter's Award." Applications available from Council Service Center and must be approved by the International Representative.
12. Assist in helping bring a foreign Scout to serve on the Camp Staff as a part of the International Camp Staff exchange program.
13. Visit a Foreign Embassy or Consulate and find out about their Scouting program if possible or about their country in general. Share your experience with your unit or a Roundtable.
