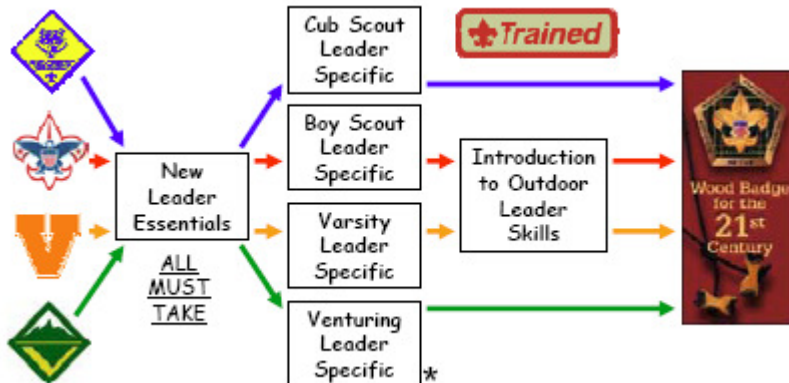
Experience the Ultimate in Scout Leadership Training

The journey from Fast Start to Wood Badge is a seamless progression for adults and an unending benefit for BSA youth. Fast Start Orientation and New Leader Essentials—the first two steps in new-leader training—introduce new leaders to the Scouting program. Leader Specific Training, as the name implies, focuses on specific leader roles and will require several days to complete, depending on an individual's previous outdoor skills experience. Wood Badge has evolved into the premier leadership course of the BSA, strengthening a leader's ability to effectively work with groups of youth and adults.

Less focused on outdoor skills, the redesigned course strengthens volunteers' ability to work with and lead groups of youth and adults. It is designed to give leaders the tools to understand how teams work; know what leadership style is appropriate to use in various situations; manage conflict; plan; communicate; and understand how to set a vision and make it come to life. It is offered in two three-day weekends or in a weeklong course.

As a result of attending Wood Badge, a course participant will:

- Acquire a global view of Scouting as a family of interrelated, value-based programs providing age-appropriate activities for youth.
- Become familiar with contemporary Team Leadership and Team Building concepts.
- Experience the stages of Team Development and practice Leadership approaches appropriate for those stages.



- Learn to use project management and Leadership methods to bring your Scouting unit together through teamwork.

Who can participate?

It's a positive learning experience for adult Volunteers at all levels: Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts, Varsity, Venturing, District and Council volunteers.

What are the qualifications and prerequisites?

- Be a registered member of the BSA.
- Complete New Leader Essentials.
- Complete Leader Specific & Outdoor Skills training appropriate to your Scouting position.

- Be capable of functioning safely in an outdoor environment.
- Successfully pass the BSA Class 3 Physical.

What do I eat?

You'll be welcomed the first three days of the course with a spread prepared by our friendly quartermaster staff. The following three days your den / patrol cooks will prepare your own meals.

If you have dietary restrictions, please notify your Wood Badge Course director before the course begins and we'll be happy to accommodate your needs.

Where do I sleep?

On the two, 3-day weekend format, participants will spend their night's outdoors tent camping in a den / patrol setting. Limited camping gear will be required.

On the 6-day, weeklong format, participants will sleep in air-conditioned dormitories.

What do I wear?

Participants are encouraged to wear a full Field Uniform to include shirt, trousers or shorts, socks, and belt. Only Scouting appropriate activity shirts and caps or hats will be allowed.

How much does it cost?

The course tuition is \$185 for the two, 3-day weekend course or \$235 for the 6-day, weeklong course. Fees include all meals, instructional materials, notebook, Wood Badge cap and neckerchief. The fee also includes your Wood Badge training award that is presented following the completion of requirements. Limited scholarships are available. Contact a Course Director for more information.

How do I register?

Visit www.longhorncouncil.org, complete the on-line registration form and use a credit card to make your payment. Or, complete the application on the front of this flyer; return it with full payment or a deposit of \$35 to the Longhorn Council office. Your application must include at least a partial payment to be considered. The first 48 fully paid Scouters who meet course requirements, will be confirmed for the course. (Note that your deposit only get's your name on the course roster, but does not guarantee you a spot.) So, get your full payment in as soon as possible.

What about refunds?

Early cancellations will result in a full refund less the \$35 deposit. No refund will be given for cancellations made within two weeks before the course begins.
