Webelos Woods is an event designed to introduce Webelos and Arrow of Light Scouts and their parents to some of the exciting adventures of Boy Scouting. The weekend is filled with fun activities, intriguing demonstrations, and plenty of outdoor excitement. Arrow of Light Scouts will have an opportunity to Bridge into Boy Scouts or be awarded their "Arrow of Light" during the evening campfire.

Dens and individuals must provide their own tents and meals for Saturday lunch and Sunday breakfast. Webelos Scouts/AOL and adults from any pack may attend either or all weekends. Come out for the day or the entire weekend.

Scouts and their parents are invited to participate as individuals or with their den. Event cost is \$22 per person which includes an event patch, program supplies, Saturday evening Dinner and insurance.

Check-in begins at 7 a.m. on Saturday with activities beginning with an opening ceremony at 9:30 a.m. Webelos Woods wraps up Sunday after Chapel Services at 10:30 a.m.

Registration by dens is encouraged; however, individual registrations will be accepted.

WEBELOS WOODS 2017 PLANNING GUIDE

**The most important part of any successful camping trip is planning!
Please read the following so you will be prepared for the weekend.**

Check-In

Plan to arrive in camp between 7:30 a.m. and 8 a.m. so you can set up your campsite. Go to the program headquarters and provide a completed Pack roster of all youth and adults that are attending. We will be able to accept final fee payments at that time. A packet will be provided for each registered Pack which includes: event wrist bands, patches, camp map, daily schedule and other flyers. Please help us by doing this before the program begins.

Put as much equipment as you can into one or more vehicles. The fewer vehicles to unload the faster everyone can get set up and start having fun. After you unload and set up camp, please remove all vehicles to the designated parking areas.

Activities

Program begins at 9:30 a.m. at the flagpole with an opening ceremony. Activities begin at 10 a.m. and end at 4:30 p.m. Dodgeball is from 4:30 – 5:15 p.m. and flag lowering at 5:20 p.m. Supper pick up from the dining hall at 5:30 p.m. and the campfire program starts at 7:30 p.m.

Choose activities that interest you and are not crowded and rotate through them all. There are approximately 2 hours before lunch and 4 hours after lunch, so budget your time to see and do it all.

Lunch

Lunch is from 12:00-1:00 p.m. Lunch is on your own in your campsite.

Supper

Activities will close around 4:30 p.m. so an adult can return to your campsite to prepare a campfire to cook your foil packets. We will furnish the food and supplies needed to prepare it. You should furnish utensils, paper towels, plates, trash bags and water. Bring barbeque tongs and gloves. A large pitcher or water cooler will be handy to mix and dispense your cold drinks. You will be cooking on your own campfire. There is no wood to be gathered at Camp so you will want to bring charcoal. If you want to have a wood fire, you will need to bring the wood with you to camp.

The staff will have dinner prep area ready at approximately at 5:30 p.m. The dinner will consist of foil chicken/beef fajitas, chips and salsa, and foil baked cinnamon apples for dessert. You will prepare these in foil packets at the prep area or campsite and cook them on your campfire in your campsite. The foil cooking is best when cooked on a charcoal fire. You will need approx. 10 lbs of charcoal for the typical den of 10 people to cook both the fajitas and apples. We recommend matchlite or its equivalent because it starts easily and doesn't burn for very long.

Campfire and Bridging Ceremony

Scouts will have an opportunity to share some skits and jokes so come to the campfire prepared. An Order of Arrow Ceremony team will provide an "Arrow of Light" and "Bridging" ceremony. Please bring all necessary items for your Scout to participate in either ceremony. If you want to celebrate after the campfire you may do so at the Council Fire Ring or back at your campsite.

Lights out

Please respect others sleep time... noise & lights out 10:30 p.m. Thank you!

Sunday Breakfast

You can prepare whatever you like for breakfast Sunday morning. Start early so that you can be at Chapel by 9:30 a.m.

Chapel

Remember that a Scout is reverent and respects the rights of others to their religious beliefs. Chapel will be a nondenominational service.

Clean em' up and move em' out

Chapel will be over around 9:45 a.m. Time to head home! Everyone should police each campsite before leaving. Remember that a Scout is clean and always leaves a campsite cleaner than when they found it. Camp closes at 11:30 a.m., if you plan to stay longer, you must clear this with the Ranger. Staff will be packing equipment and not able to provide any supervision.

Rules to help you plan

1. If a Scout and an adult are sharing one tent, then the adult must be a parent or guardian of the boy. Adults sharing tents with youth is discouraged.
2. NO ONE IS TO RIDE IN THE BACK OF A PICKUP. You must have seatbelts for each person in the vehicle.
3. The MAXIMUM speed in camp is about 10 miles per hour. If there are youth around then one must drive NO faster than walking speed (about 3 MPH).
4. Instructors on the BB and Archery range have a heavy responsibility for your child's safety. They can and will ask anyone that is not serious to leave the area. Please help them to keep the ranges safe.
5. Please do not leave camp property without notifying the staff.
6. Bring a poncho, raincoat, or other rain gear with you. The show will go on rain or shine.
7. Since we will be providing a trained staff, you do not need WEBELOS Outdoor trained adults to attend.
8. Remember that we are here for the boys and that we must let them have fun.
9. All trash must be taken out of camp with you when you leave.
