Cub Scouting 101

Cub Scouting is a Family Adventure! Cub Scouting is a family-centered program. Parents and guardians play an important role in their Scout's experience by participating in activities, helping with advancement, and sharing in the fun and excitement of Scouting. Throughout the year, your Scout will learn new skills, build confidence, develop leadership abilities, make lasting friendships, and create memories that will stay with them for a lifetime.

Parent Participation Required: Cub Scouts is not a “drop-off” program. A parent/guardian must attend all Pack and Den activities with their Scout, including meetings, campouts, outings, and events. Siblings and other family members are welcome and encouraged to participate in Pack activities.

Your Scout Belongs to a Pack. A “Pack” is the larger Cub Scout group that includes all Scouts from Kindergarten through 5th grade, along with their families and adult leaders. The Pack typically gathers once each month for a Pack Meeting, where all Cub Scouts and their families come together for fun and recognition. Pack meetings are led by the Cubmaster and Assistant Cubmasters and often include:

- Games and activities
- Skits and songs
- Special guests and demonstrations
- Award presentations & Advancement ceremonies
- Important Pack announcements

Pack meetings are a great opportunity for Scouts to celebrate their accomplishments and build friendships with Scouts from other grade levels. **Our Pack Calendar for this year is included on page 6 of this packet!**

Your Scout Also Belongs to a Den. A “Den” is a smaller group of Scouts in the same grade level. Most advancement activities happen during Den meetings. Each Den is led by a volunteer Den Leader and often supported by one or more Assistant Den Leaders, all of whom are parents from the Pack. During Den meetings, typically held once a month, Cub Scouts work on adventures and activities that help them earn their rank badge. Meetings may include:

- Outdoor skills
- Hands-on activities & Crafts and projects
- Games and team-building activities
- Service projects
- Ceremonies and traditions

Pack 928 Overview

The Pack Committee Makes It All Happen. Behind every successful Pack is a team of dedicated parent volunteers known as the “Pack Committee.” Our Committee works together to support the Cubmaster, plan activities, manage finances, coordinate volunteers, and ensure the Pack delivers a high-quality program for every Scout.

Every Family Can Help! Cub Scouting is entirely volunteer-led. The quality of the program our Scouts enjoy depends on parents and guardians who are willing to share a small amount of their time and talents. **You do not need prior Scouting experience to help.** Your involvement, no matter how small or large, makes a tremendous difference.

In fact, one of the things that makes Pack 928 special is the involvement of our families. Our Pack is particularly strong because of the families who pitch in to make great experiences possible for our Cubs. As the Pack continues to grow, we need more parents to help—whether that's assisting with a single event, helping with a specific activity, serving on our Pack Committee, or taking on a small behind-the-scenes role. Most volunteer opportunities require only a few hours throughout the year. If every family contributes a little, no one has to do a lot.

Scouting is More Fun with Friends. Cub Scouts can join at any time during the year—not just during our fall recruiting season. One of the best ways to grow our Pack is through personal invitations. If your Scout enjoys Cub Scouting, encourage them to invite friends, classmates, neighbors, and teammates to join. And remember, Scouting is open to everyone—girls and boys!

Pack Dues. Our Pack's yearly dues (which are separate from Scouting's annual national registration dues) are **\$100 per Scout**. These dues cover the expenses for adventure awards, patches, certificates, neckerchiefs, website fees, rental fees for event and storage spaces, derby cars and regatta boats, and nearly all non-camping events for the year. There are a few other events that may have an additional cost. In recent years, the only additional cost has been for overnight camping and special trips (e.g., NASA Camp). Individual Dens may also attend special events that are not covered by the Pack dues.

We never want a Scout to miss out on a fun adventure due to cost constraints. If a Scout's family is unable to pay for an event, scholarships are available on a limited basis. Please inquire with our Committee Chair or Treasurer.

Pack Meetings:

- As you'll see from our Calendar, our Pack at least once per month on a Sunday. While Whites Chapel Methodist Church hosts many of our events, our Pack holds several events in other locations around the Southlake area.
- Pack leadership will send out frequent updates with schedule details and, if necessary, changes. You can always find the latest info on the Pack's website.
- We are exceptionally proud of our high-quality programming. Look for a diverse set of fun, Scouting-related events and activities throughout the year, including:
 - **CAMPING**: We camp at least twice per year—in the Fall and in the Spring. However, we try to schedule additional camping opportunities when we can, including special camping events, such as Halloween Campouts sponsored by our Council, and even Space Camp at NASA in Houston!
 - **FISHING**: We always open our school year with a fun-filled fishing derby. Some fish are bigger than our Lion cubs! And that's not an old fishing tale!
 - **HIKING**: We hike at Bob Jones Nature Preserve each year, but also do some hiking at our campouts!
 - **ARCHERY / BB GUNS**: Cub Scouts can do shooting sports—including archery, BB guns, and slingshots—at District and Council events. We try to schedule at least two of these opportunities each year!
 - **PINEWOOD DERBY / RAINGUTTER REGATTA**: Our Pack proudly hosts two premiere "Race Day" events each year, including a classic Cub Scout Pinewood Derby and Raingutter Regatta. WE also sponsor workshop days for families that need a little extra help building their derby cars.
 - **BOATING**: We do boating at Camp Tahuaya in Belton, TX. This year, we are heading there in November for our annual Fall Campout.
 - **COMMUNITY SERVICE**: Each year we host a Scouting for Food drive here in Southlake. We are also always looking at additional ways to serve our community!

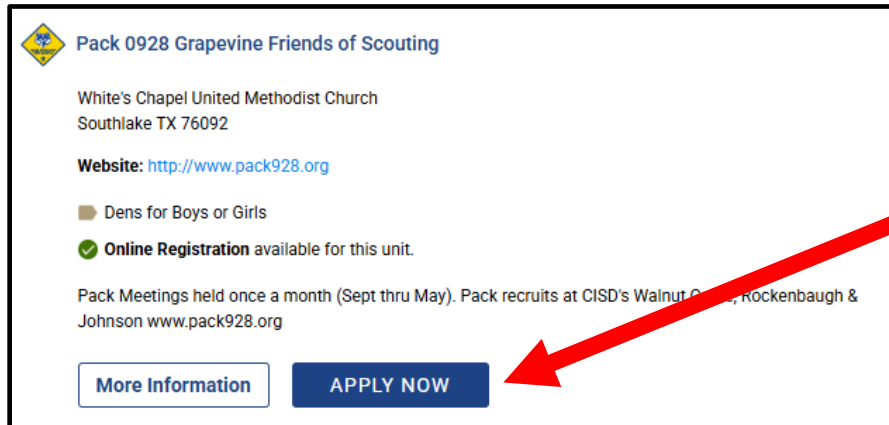

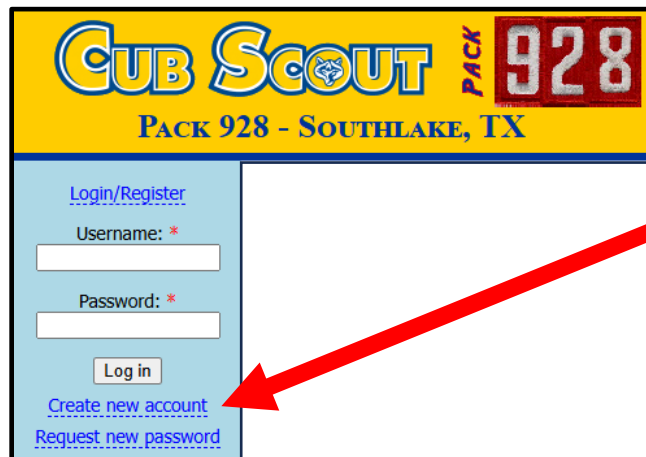

Getting Started: UNIFORM & HANDBOOK

After Registration is complete, your next steps are to purchase an Official Scouting America Cub Scout Uniform and an Official Cub Scout Handbook.

Everything you need to participate in Scouting can be purchased:

- Online at the **Official Online Scout Shop** (<https://www.scoutshop.org/>); or
- In-person at a Local Scout Shop. The closest Scout Shop to Southlake is the **Longhorn Scout Shop** in Hurst. The Shop sells uniforms with some patches pre-sewn for convenience – and they can sew additional patches for you for a small fee!

THE OFFICIAL CUB SCOUT UNIFORM. Pack 928 Scouts will need two types of uniforms: a “Field Uniform,” and an “Activity Uniform.”

The **Field Uniform**, often called the “Class A” Uniform, is the official Cub Scout uniform. It includes the Cub Scout uniform shirt with appropriate patches, Cub Scout pants/shorts, hat, neckerchief and slide, belt, and other uniform components. Wearing the Field Uniform helps Scouts take pride in their achievements, promotes unity, and reinforces the values of Scouting.



- A complete Official Cub Scout Field Uniform consists of:
 - **UNIFORM SHIRT** (\$32.99)
 - Lions, Tigers, Wolves, Bears, and Webelos: Official Blue Uniform Shirt
 - Webelos can alternatively wear the Official Khaki Uniform Shirt
 - Lions can alternative wear the Lions t-shirt
 - Arrow of Light: Official Khaki Uniform Shirt
 - **UNIFORM SHORTS, PANTS, or SKORTS** (\$19.99 – \$32.99) (*all ranks*)
 - **UNIFORM BELT** (\$14.99) (*all ranks*)
 - **UNIFORM SOCKS** (\$7.99) (*all ranks*)
 - **HAT** (**Rank Specific**) (\$22.99)
 - **NECKERCHIEF and NECKERCHIEF SLIDE** (\$7.99) (**Rank Specific**)
 - Pack 928 gifts each Cub Scout their neckerchief for their next rank as part of its May Pack Event
- Scouts should wear their Field Uniform to:
 - Pack Meetings
 - Den Meetings
 - Flag ceremonies
 - Recruiting events
 - Advancement ceremonies
 - Other formal Scouting activities

The local Scout Shop can help you pick out correct uniform parts, explain placement, and even do the actual sewing for you! Below is an insignia and patch placement guide:

Right Sleeve

- **U.S. Flag Emblem**
- **Den Number**
 - Centered directly below the Flag

Left Sleeve

- **Council Shoulder Patch**
 - Aligned with the sleeve seam
- **Unit Numerals**
 - Centered directly below Council Patch

Left Pocket

- **World Crest Emblem**
 - Worn centered above the left pocket
- **World Crest Ring (optional)**
 - Encircles the World Crest Emblem
- **Cub Scout Rank Emblems**
 - Lion, Tiger, Wolf, and Bear rank emblems form a diamond shape on the left pocket
 - The Webelos emblem does not complete the diamond and is worn centered on the left pocket
- **Arrow of Light Emblem**
 - Worn below the left pocket on the tan Scouts BSA uniform, signifying the transition from Cub Scouts to Scouts BSA

Right Pocket

- **Temporary Patches**
 - May also be worn here using a pocket hanger loop
- **Recruiter Strip**
 - Worn immediately below the right pocket



The **Activity Uniform**, often called the “Class B” Uniform, typically consists of a Pack, District, Council, camp, or Scouting-themed t-shirt worn with appropriate shorts or pants. Activity Uniforms are comfortable, practical, and help Scouts identify one another while participating in fun outdoor adventures.

Pack 928 will be making custom t-shirts this year that will be available for purchase, but are not required. Stay tuned for more details.

- Scouts often wear their Activity Uniform during:
 - Outdoor activities
 - Campouts (other than for Flag Ceremonies and breakfast/dinner)
 - Service projects
 - Hiking events
 - Field trips
 - Other active or messy activities

Ranks, Advancement, and Awards

Advancement is one of the key methods of Cub Scouting. Through advancement, Scouts learn new skills, explore new interests, build confidence, and develop character. As Scouts complete “Adventures” (belt loops) and earn awards, they gain a sense of accomplishment while having fun with their friends and family.

Cub Scout Ranks. Cub Scouts are organized by grade level, and each grade has its own rank:

- **Lion:** Kindergarten
- **Tiger:** 1st Grade
- **Wolf:** 2nd Grade
- **Bear:** 3rd Grade
- **Webelos:** 4th Grade
- **Arrow of Light:** 5th Grade



Scouts work toward the rank that corresponds to their current grade level. They do not need to earn previous ranks in order to earn their current rank.

How Advancement Works. Each Cub Scout begins by earning their rank’s Bobcat Adventure, which introduces the Scout Oath, Scout Law, and other fundamentals of Scouting. After earning Bobcat, Scouts work on a series of adventures throughout the year with their Den, Pack, and family.

To earn their rank badge, Scouts must complete **6 Required Adventures** and any **2 Elective Adventures**.

Required adventures teach core Scouting skills and values, while elective adventures allow Scouts to explore topics that interest them, such as camping, STEM, outdoor skills, citizenship, sports, conservation, and more.

Most advancement requirements are completed during Den meetings and Pack activities. However, it is always a possibility to complete adventures that were missed at home! Scouting is designed to be flexible and parents should note that they’ll be able to work on adventures at home with their Cub Scout to ensure they earn their rank badge despite other time commitments and youth activities.

Awards and Recognition. In addition to earning their rank badge, our Cub Scouts have opportunities throughout the year to earn a variety of special awards and recognitions through Pack events, Den activities, summer programs, day camps, and family activities.

At Pack 928, we believe it is important to recognize Scouts for their achievements. Advancement and awards are celebrated regularly during Den and Pack meetings, where Cub Scouts are recognized for their hard work and accomplishments.

Parent Participation. Parents and guardians play an important role in the advancement process. You are your Scout's most important mentor and partner in their Scouting journey. Helping your Scout complete activities at home, encouraging participation, and celebrating accomplishments are all important parts of the Cub Scout program.

Pack 928 uses **Scoutbook** to track advancement and awards. Parents should create an account and regularly review their Scout's progress. A link to Scoutbook can be found on the Pack website or accessed directly at: <https://advancements.scouting.org/login>

Crossing Over to Scouts BSA. The Arrow of Light rank is the highest rank in Cub Scouting. Cub Scouts who choose to continue their Scouting adventure by joining a Scouts BSA troop will participate in a special Bridging Ceremony held in February at our Pack's annual Blue & Gold Banquet. On to Eagle!



Throughout the year, local Scouts BSA troops host activities and visits for Arrow of Light Scouts to learn about troop life, meet youth leaders, and experience the exciting adventures that await them. At the conclusion of the Bridging Ceremony, Scouts are welcomed into their new troop and begin the next chapter of their Scouting journey.

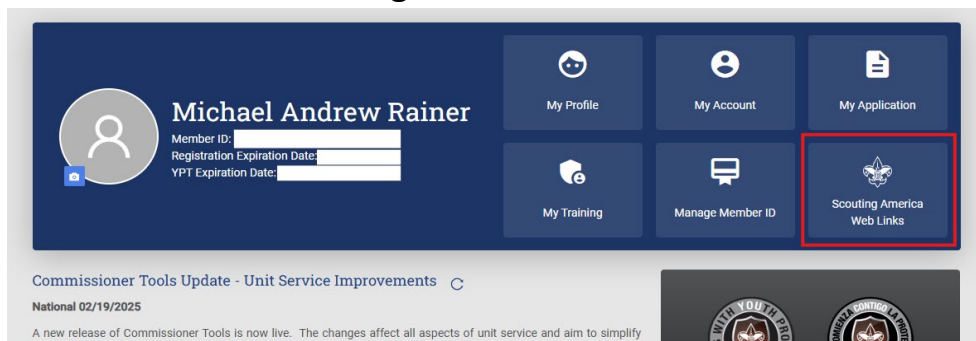

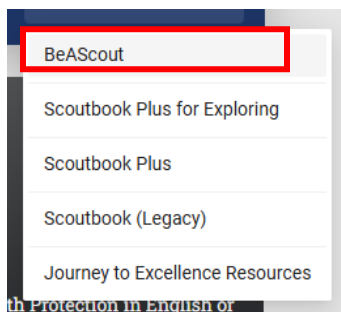
How to register for Cub Scout Pack 928, Southlake Texas

1. Register with the Scouting America (Formerly National BSA)

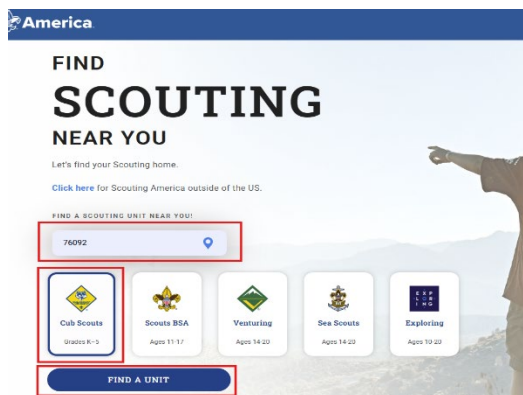
- a. Go to <https://my.scouting.org> and create an account. This will be your account as a parent. You will add your child(ren) as scouts in a later step.

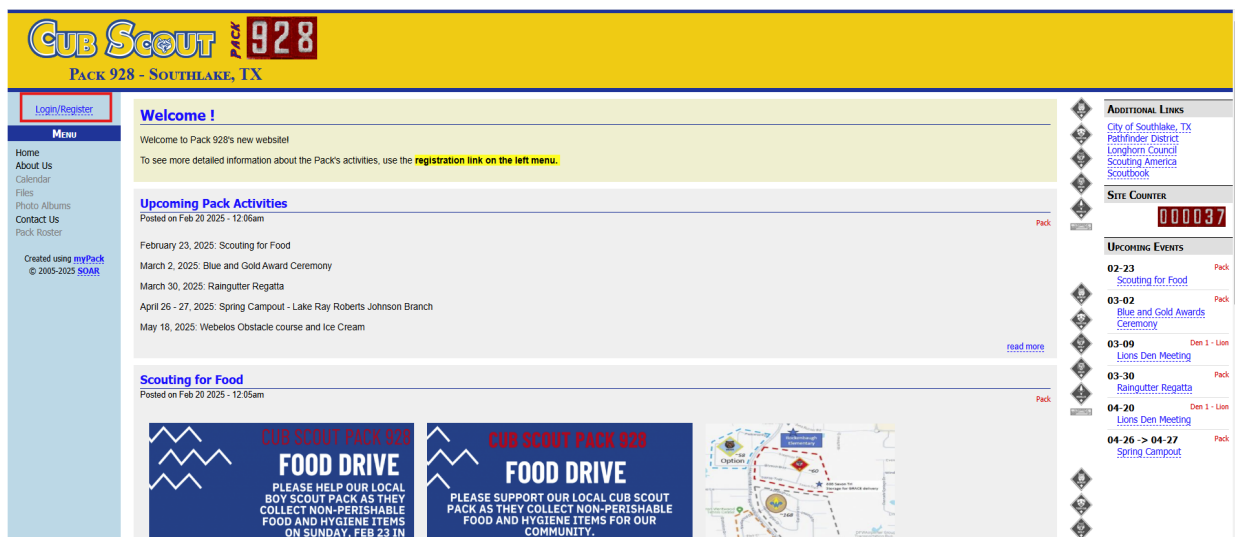
