



Basic Archery Instructor Course

Saturday-Sunday, November 3-4, 2018

For Boy Scout, Varsity, and Venturing Adults
Worth Ranch

This course is for adults who would like to run an archery program for their Troop or Crew, and to be Archery Merit Badge counselors. Upon completion, students will receive the **Basic Archery Instructor** certification, instructor card (valid for 3 years), the Instructor’s Manual, and a Longhorn Council Archery Instructor’s patch.

Cost: Register through the Longhorn Council Camping Registrar - \$75.00 (check payable to Longhorn Council). This is open to registered BSA adults or youth age 18 and older, and to other participants with instructor’s permission.

Location: Worth Ranch

Dates & times: Saturday, Nov. 3, 2018 8:30 a.m. – 6:00 p.m. AND
Sunday, Nov. 4, 2018 8:30 a.m. – 1:00 p.m. (approx.)

Class Size: Class size is limited to 20 participants.

Deadline: 5 pm, Thursday, October 25, 2018 (need to order materials)

Lodging: You may camp at Worth Ranch at the Ole Man Gillespie Campsite by the range starting Friday night at no cost. Food is not provided. Note that tobacco and alcohol products are not allowed on Scout ranches. Personal firearms are not allowed, and archery equipment may only be brought with the instructor’s approval.

Basic Archery Instructor Training

Course Information

The key to a successful archery program is a trained staff. If quality Archery is part of your Troop or Crew program, send your candidate to the **USA Archery/NFAA** Basic Instructor course being sponsored by Longhorn Council (**used to be NAA Level 1**). The course is 12 hours in length and costs \$75. It includes all necessary Archery Instructor training and materials. It's excellent for senior youth. This is a 2-day class.

The training course outline is the official archery instructor course used by both the **USA Archery (formerly NAA) and NFAA**. The course will be presented by Course Director Don Goldston. Course size is limited to the first **20** pre-paid candidates. Registration deadline is Thursday, April 27, so materials can be ordered.

Instructor candidates will learn to operate a safe and educational Archery Range. An Instructor manual is issued and teaching methods are practiced. Certification is valid 3 years. This course and certification is required to run archery activities for Scouts and Venturers, etc., and is required to become reserve and run any LHC camp archery range. Instructor cards are only issued upon course completion. In addition, activities required for the Archery Merit Badge will be addressed, i.e. string-making, arrow building, along with BSA policies.

Course Requirements:

- 1) Be registered with a BSA Troop or Crew. Other participants are welcome, understanding they will be on Scout property;
- 2) Attend the entire course;
- 3) Pass a written archery test with a score of 75% or better; and,
- 4) Serve effectively as a student instructor during training.

Shooting skills are not required, but helpful. Camp archery equipment will be supplied by Longhorn Council, sponsor of this NADA Basic Archery Instructor training course.
